Change Notification UK National Blood Services No. 19 - 2009

Body Piercing

Applies to the Whole Blood and Components Donor Selection Guidelines only

Obligatory Must not donate if:

Less than12 months after last piercing.

Discretionary If after 4 months a validated test for hepatitis B core antibody is negative,

accept.

Additional Piercing has passed infection from person to person. Waiting twelve months Information

helps to ensure that the infections tested for by the Blood Services will be

picked up.

This guidance presumes that a validated NAT test for hepatitis C is negative, if this test is stopped for any reason the guidance will change.

During the recovery phase of HBV infection levels of free HBsAg may be too

low to detect and antibody to hepatitis B core antigen may be the only

indicator of infectivity.
