Animal Bite

Applies to Donor Selection Guidelines - Whole Blood and Components

Obligatory Must not donate if:

Any wound is infected or not healed.

See if relevant Infection - General

Rabies

Additional Information Animal bites may result in many different infections. Allowing all

wounds to heal and for any obvious infection to have resolved should avoid problems. Rabies, and similar diseases, have long incubation periods and do not show as a wound infection. There is however no evidence that these infections have ever been

transmitted through a blood transfusion. These diseases appear to be confined to the nervous system during their incubation periods. There is evidence that they have been transmitted through organ and ocular transplants. For this reason there are different rules for

material that may contain nervous system tissue.
