Eye Disease

These changes apply to the Deceased Tissue Donor Selection Guidelines

Please make the following changes to the entry:

Obligatory

- 1. Must not donate if:
- a) Active ocular inflammation or infection.
- b) Ocular tissue transplanted.
- 2. Eyes.
- a) Active ocular inflammation or infection.
- ab) Congenital or acquired ocular disorders or previous ocular surgery that may preclude a successful graft outcome. This includes laser refractive surgery to the cornea. This includes iridocorneal syndrome and keratoconus.
- **bc**) History of malignant tumours of the anterior segment or retinoblastoma.

Discretionary

- 1. Eyes:
- a) If laser surgery was to the retina, accept.
- b) If cataract surgery, accept.
- 2. Other Tissues:

If no other contraindication, accept.

Reason for Change

1. To remove prior laser refractive surgery to the cornea as a contraindication to eye donation, and to add iridocorneal syndrome and keratoconus as contraindications to eye donation.

2. To clarify that active ocular inflammation or infection is only a contraindication for eye donation

3. To remove discretionary section

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
