

- An invite has been circulated to attend a convalescent plasma webinar.



#### **Key Notes**

- We have transfused our first Granulocytes and in the coming weeks we will complete a plasma exchange within ITU.
- Two new processes pathway for urgent elective surgical patients and managing their Anaemia within pre-asses areas.
- We are also looking to update the cell salvage machine.
- We are almost ready to go live with the Blood360 project.

#### **Key Notes**

- We are currently using O+ in major haemorrhage.
- We have achieved a threshold of less than 12.5 on O- and reduced wastage.
- We have made a few changes to our transfusion doc to support the O+ initiative.
- We are currently preparing for a UKAS inspection.

#### **Key Notes**

- We have now implemented the Patient ID Verification rule.
- The next project will be the O+ to Males.
- We will also complete the bedside app.
- There has been a large amount of plasma exchanges with TTP's including Ad Hoc to replace Octaplas.

- DS shared their success in managing blood stocks and reducing wastage. YF credited DS for her hard work and help with this.
- In the process of our NIPT Pre-Fetal DNA program across the Ante-natal testing program.
- We now have a full-time traceability team.



#### 4. Feedback from RTC Tasks Groups

#### 4.1 Audits



- BH gave an overview of the preliminary results of the 2020 Blood Product Survey During Covid.
- This was the brainchild of Mike Murphy in Feb 2020.
- It started as a simple spreadsheet but due to expansion an online form has now been created.
- They received over 4000 submissions over 80 different organisations to date.
- A new national audit regarding the replacement of cell salvage machines is currently being worked on, there is no pending launch date at present.
- BH is also involved in another new national audit regarding the use of frozen products which will be launched sometime in the new year.
- BH has been working on several surveys around education and the NMA course.
- YS and BH have been in discussion regarding rebooting the RTC audit agenda to aid in boosting the number of projects being sent through to BH. He commented that he is available as a facility to utilise for any upcoming projects that require data collection.
- BH announced that he had now formally retired but has returned on a renewable part time contract.
- JC formally thanked BH for his many years of full-time service and the support he has
  given the transfusion community both nationally and regionally. He also personally
  extended his thanks for the support he has given both him and this region over years.
  He hopes that he continues to be a critical part of the transfusion jigsaw for many years
  to come.

#### 4.2 Education and training

#### Regional Workplan

• There have been discussions around a regional workplan which would become part of our agenda. A meeting will take place next week regarding this.

#### **NMA Course**

 There has been a lot of discussion regarding the NMA course which was due to run in December. This was cancelled due to work demands and to make sure we were able to deliver a course standard we are happy with.



#### **Annual Symposium**

 This will be a joint virtual education day between the Yorkshire and Humber and East Midlands regions. Discussions around speakers will take place offline. All ideas would be welcomed.

#### 5. Feedback from RTC Associated Groups

#### 5.1 – EM Transfusion Practitioners Group

 We have already had a virtual meeting and have another meeting pending in the next month or so.

#### 5.2 - National Lab Managers Group

- DS gave updates on behalf of HC.
- A lessons learnt document is currently being written regarding the impact Covid has had on Blood Banks.
- MHRA has updated and advised that less reports are being submitted due to the pandemic.
- Both UKAS and MHRA have met to discuss the discrepancies in conflicting advice and requirements, which has raised concerns and impacted on Blood Banks. Currently there has been no further progress with this. Blood Bank Managers and Lab Managers will be sent a request to highlight the differences and the issues arising around this matter.
- A 12-month trial has started to provide 6-day Granulocytes instead of 5 days. This began
  on the 14<sup>th</sup> September and these will be available Mon-Sat. This was decided following
  feedback from Clinicians and Lab Managers as they felt there was demand for this
  product. These can also be ordered on Bank Holidays subject to availability.
- There will be a change to the contact details for orders and enquiries of HLA Selected Platelets. This will take place using a phased approach, with Sheffield putting the change in place from the 5<sup>th</sup> October.
- DS contacted hospitals in the region to encourage them to take a share of O-K+ units. This received a positive response and will be monitored with keen interest.

#### 5.3 - National TP Network

- A meeting took place to discuss another virtual education event after the success of the recent one.
- DS raised the 'Lessons Learnt' document in partnership with the TP Network and the Lab Managers Groups. The document is extensive and very informative and is currently awaiting final sign off. This will then be sent to the National Committee and put on the JPAC website when complete.



- A generic framework for TP's is currently being worked on by a sub-committee. Currently
  job descriptions are written from scratch. The framework will encompass roles from
  starter through to senior TP.
- Discussions took place regarding the Nightingale hospital and the lack of training and the incomplete paperwork, which was a massive learning curve for them.

#### 6. NHSBT Matters

#### O+ to Bleeding Men by JSh

- As part of Jo's role within the O- working group for NBTC she is taking the lead in a second project which is O+ to bleeding males in trauma and major haemorrhage.
- The national objective is to promote the use of O+ to adult males.
- The steering group's first meeting is on the 16<sup>th</sup> October and will look at ways to cascade to the regions.
- We will be looking for interested colleagues from either a clinical, TP or Lab background to form small subgroups regionally to promote this project. To register your interest please contact Jo Shorthouse.
- Some Hospitals/Trusts have already implemented this and could help by offering their insight and experience which could provide resources for others to use.
- Will feedback at the next RTC on progress.

#### **Regional PBM Dashboard**

 In order to gain insight into regional initiatives for patient blood management, JSh will be sending out a spreadsheet to gauge where we are as a region. A dashboard can then be created to ascertain regional progress which can be brought to future RTC meetings for comments, discussion and to share good practice.

#### 7. AOB

#### 7.1 Research and Development Survey

• JC asked people if they would complete the research and development survey. NHSBT are looking to develop their 5-year strategy regarding products. The last one had a very poor response, but this could have been mainly due to the timing. If you could share widely among the Hospital Transfusion community, Haematology and Surgical Transfusion. It is important to get data so we can be sure to direct funding to the relevant research.

#### 7.2 Transfusion 2024

 The 2024 overarching 5-year strategic document which is co-owned by the NBTC and NHSBT is in its final drafts. This will be released in a few short weeks. Shortly afterwards the annual report by the NBTC, which is currently approaching final draft, will be published. The terms of reference are also being finalised but there are no major changes.

# 7.3 Regional Boundaries

• It has been agreed with the NBTC that we will move from ten regions to seven to align with NHS England boundaries. This is to ensure that transfusion 2024 gets the accountability it needs to improve transfusion across the NHS and will also make it make it easier to report poor transfusion practice. This will drive regulators to take note of transfusion practice across England and by doing so, we can enter into key lines of enquiry, which is how the CQC measures secondary care organisations. This will not be a cost saving exercise and we would like to hear any ideas on how this should look in the future moving forward.

#### 7.4 Education

Discussions took place regarding how we look at education in the foreseeable future.
 We may have to continue education in a more effective virtual way, perhaps in the form of a national curriculum.



• It was proposed this morning in the RTT meeting to use this year's budget for the RC Path event, 'Advances in Transfusion Medicine.' This will be open to colleagues that don't usually get an opportunity to attend events and concessional prices of £50 are open to BMS, Trainees, Nurses and Retired. There were no objections, and this was duly accepted. JSh and DB will organisation this.

#### 7.5 Restructure of Senior Management

 There will be a clinical restructure of Senior Management, with the creation of a new post within NHSBT to support Transfusion 2024.

#### 7.6 Expressions of Interest for the Next RTC Chair

As a result of the boundary changes expressions of interest will be placed on hold whilst
we work out what the regions will look like. JC has permission from the Chair and Chief
Medical Officer of NHSBT to remain in position for the foreseeable future.

#### 7.7 O-K+ External Suppliers

YF expressed raising engagement with external suppliers regarding grouping cards, this
would allow us to test patients and make informed decisions on the relevance and safety
of using O-K+ and would make the process much easier.

JC agreed to take this to the NBTC for discussion and asked if this could be taken offline and for someone to contact him to ensure he understands what is being requested.

#### **Finally**

 JC thanked JSh and DB and the rest of NHSBT for putting this together and everyone for attending.

#### 8. Future RTC meetings

- RTC meetings will take place bi-annually in April & October.
- The next meeting will take place on the 9<sup>th</sup> April 2021.
