

UK Cell Salvage Action Group Terms of Reference

Background

The UK Cell Salvage Action Group (UKCSAG) was established in 2006 to help support the wider implementation of cell salvage as an alternative to donor blood and to facilitate a UK approach to its use. The group reports to the Patient Blood Management Steering Group in England and the equivalent groups in the devolved countries.

Purpose

The purpose of the UKCSAG is to provide a UK wide approach to:

- Support the safe implementation of cell salvage and publish resources to support the development of services in hospitals
- Provide templates and tools to assist in this
- Convene a body of clinical expertise in cell salvage providing guidance on techniques, indications/contraindications, answering queries and providing guidance to other professional/DH groups e.g. NICE
- Liaise and cooperate with commercial manufacturers of cell salvage equipment, providing resources to encourage safe and consistent practice
- Make recommendations considered to be best practice
- Provide names of cell salvage advisors from different specialities/roles

Composition

- All four UK countries will be represented and a representative from the Republic of Ireland will be invited.
- Quorate requirements will include three of the four UK countries represented and a minimum of six members (total) in attendance. Quorate requirements must be met for decisions to be ratified
- Membership will consist of core, virtual and co-opted members
- Virtual and co-opted members will provide expert advice and assistance on specific projects, respectively, to the group; they will not be required to regularly attend meetings
- Senior representatives from two of the 4 UK blood services will co-Chair the group, the Chairs' positions will be reviewed every two years (alternate years)
- Membership of the group will be representative of the professions and specialities practising/using cell salvage and be considered experts in relation to cell salvage e.g.
 - Anaesthetist
 - o ODP/ODA
 - Obstetrician
 - o Paediatric Specialist
 - o Perfusionist
 - o Transfusion Practitioners
 - Other "non profit making" groups who specialise in cell salvage
- The group will meet at least twice a year, face to face or by telecon
- Non attending core members will be contacted after every two years to establish if they wish to stay on the group
- An additional annual meeting with the manufacturers will be attended by the Chairs and a small selection of members

Reporting lines

- Minutes will be available following all meetings
- An annual report of activities will be produced at the end of each financial year; this generic report will be available for members/blood service representatives to submit as required within their organisation's structure

Activities / Responsibilities

- All members have a responsibility to actively contribute to the group and to inform the group of any declarations of interest; regular attendance at meetings is required
- All members share the responsibility for producing/maintaining/updating badged resources
- All resources will be posted in the transfusion practice section of the Transfusion Guidelines (IPAC) website
- Clinical experts within the group will provide specialist advice/responses to queries
- Members must seek approval from the Chairs for any articles and/or presentations using the UKCSAG name or logo
